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1. Background to the Act

The *Law Enforcement (Controlled Operations) Act 1997* ('the Act') was introduced to provide for the authorisation, conduct and monitoring of operations involving what might otherwise be unlawful activities by specified law enforcement agencies. The Act came into force on 1 March 1998 and the first operation was authorised on 1 March 1998.

The Act is generally considered to balance the competing public interests of better enabling law enforcement authorities to detect and convict wrong doers while ensuring that those entrusted with law enforcement do not impeach the integrity of the system they seek to uphold by their own actions.

The Act was specifically enacted as a response to the ruling in *Ridgeway v R*¹ and also in compliance with a recommendation of the Royal Commission into the NSW Police Service.

2. The Law Enforcement (Controlled Operations) Act

The Act provides for controlled operations to be authorised and conducted by four NSW law enforcement agencies: the NSW Police, the NSW Crime Commission (Crime Commission), the Independent Commission Against Corruption ('ICAC') and the Police Integrity Commission ('PIC'). Three Commonwealth agencies are also prescribed as law enforcement agencies for the purposes of the Act - the Australian Federal Police ('AFP'), the Australian Customs Service ('ACS'), and the Australian Crime Commission ('ACC').

The Act also confers upon the Ombudsman the role of an independent monitor of compliance by the law enforcement agencies with the Act's requirements.

The granting of an authority to carry out a controlled operation can be distinguished from authorities for such agencies to use telephone interceptions or listening devices, in that they require a judicial officer to grant a warrant, having first examined the basis of the application. In the case of controlled operations, the authority is granted from **within** the respective agencies by the chief executive officer or delegate. Accordingly, it is monitoring by the Ombudsman that constitutes the prime oversighting of the use of this contentious power.

The Act fulfils two important public policy purposes. Firstly, it provides law enforcement agencies with a powerful tool to investigate and thwart serious criminal activity and corrupt conduct. Secondly, the monitoring regime set up by the Act provides a strict form of accountability, which should minimise abuse of the operational realities of criminal and corruption undercover work.

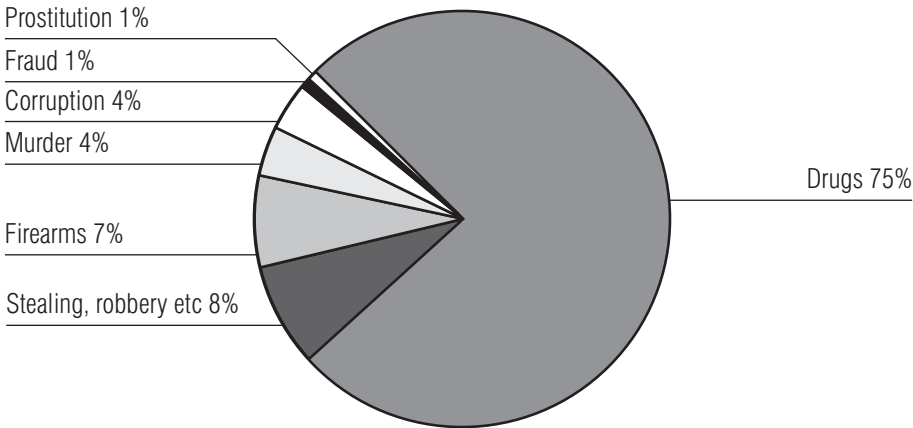

3. Statistical overview since inception of the Act

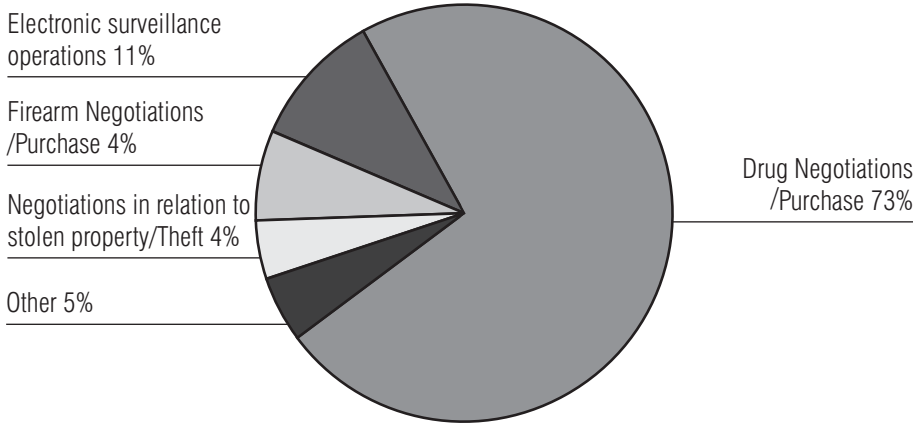
Since 1 March 1998 the majority of operations have been targeted against some form of drug related activity, for example, the possession, supply or manufacture of prohibited drugs. The next major criminal conduct targeted has been stealing and robbery offences including armed robbery offences followed by firearms offences. There is some overlap in these figures as on some occasions several types of criminal conduct were targeted in the one operation

Criminal activity targeted in controlled operations 1998 - 2004



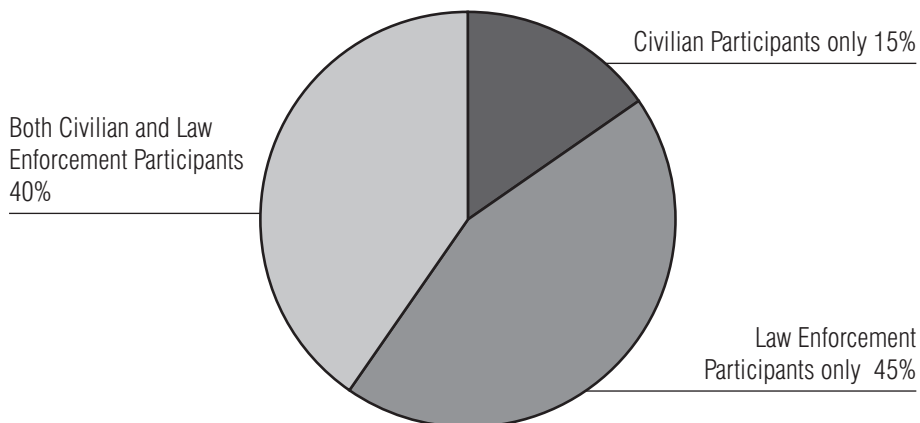
Not surprisingly the majority of controlled activities (which are the specific actions conducted as part of the operation that would otherwise be unlawful) have involved the negotiation and purchase of prohibited drugs. Operations undertaken in order to install certain surveillance equipment such as listening devices were the next largest activity undertaken.

Types of controlled activity authorised 1998 - 2004



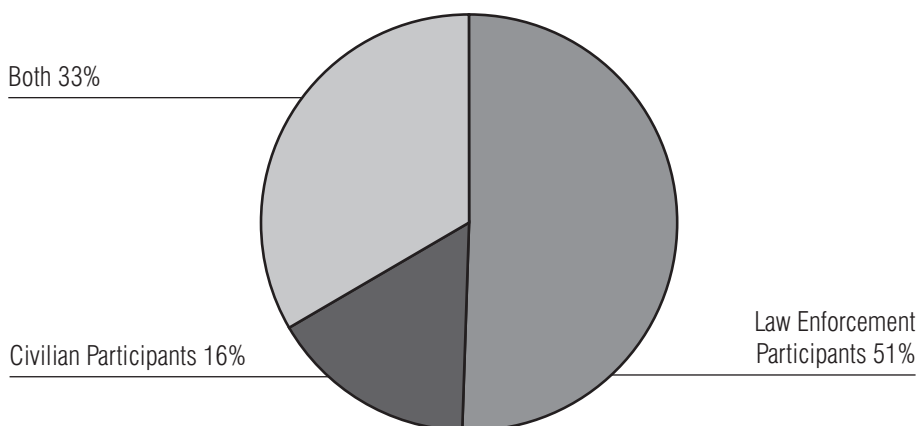
The majority of operations authorised law enforcement officers or both law enforcement officers and civilians to take part. Only 15% of operations involved authorising civilian participants alone.

Participants authorised in operations 1998 - 2004



Due to operational contingencies, usually a smaller number of authorised participants actually conduct controlled activities. The majority of participants who conduct controlled activities during operations again are either law enforcement participants alone or in concert with civilian participants. In 16% of the operations in which controlled activities occurred civilians acted alone.

Participants conducting controlled activities 1998 - 2004

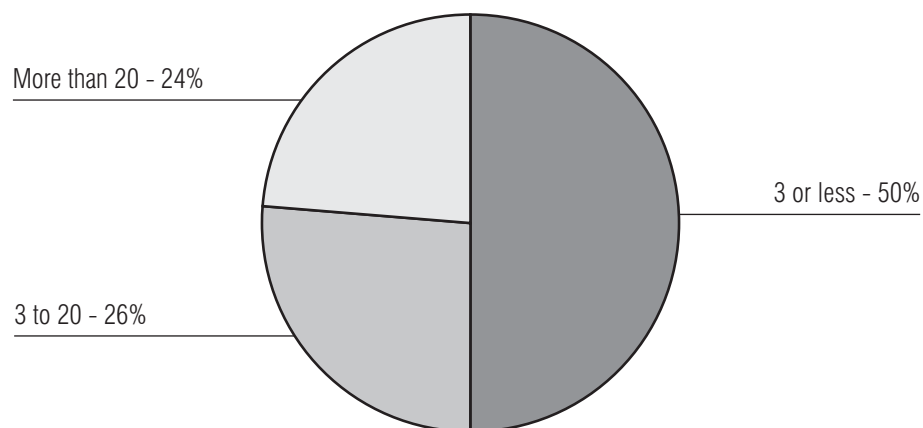


The number of law enforcement participants authorised has ranged from 1 to 231. However the majority of operations involved 3 or less law enforcement participants. Since the inception of the Act in 1998, 50% of operations have involved 3 or less law enforcement participants. 24% of operations authorised more than 20 law enforcement participants

Operations involving a large number of law enforcement participants are generally of two main types. Firstly, operations targeting street level drug dealing in specific geographical locations generally involve the participation of a large number of police.

The other type of operations that necessitate a large number of authorised law enforcement participants are those involving installation of surveillance equipment. For timing and logistical reasons these operations usually authorise a large number of law enforcement participants who can be potentially called upon to carry out the controlled activities, but usually only a small number of law enforcement participants actually do so.³

4. Review of the Act

The Act was initially reviewed in April 1999 and a number of subsequent amendments made.

Section 32 (4) of the Act provides that a further review of the Act be undertaken as soon as possible after 1 December 2002. The Ministry of Police undertook the review and a draft report was issued in November 2003.

I made submissions to the review and also provided comments on the draft report. The final report of the review was tabled in Parliament on 23 June 2004.

A number of the recommendations of the review, including the creation of a two-tier approach to streamline the approval of certain routine or minor operations, will require amendments to the Act. The Ministry for Police has informed me that I will be given an opportunity to comment on the draft Bill currently in preparation.

5. Inspection Overview

During the 2003-2004 financial year, 364 controlled operations were authorised and 223 completed.

Authorisations by NSW Police in 2003/2004 increased by more than 60%. The NSW Crime Commission authorised slightly fewer operations and the Police Integrity Commission authorised slightly more operations. The number of operations authorised by the Independent Commission Against Corruption were static.

6. NSW Police

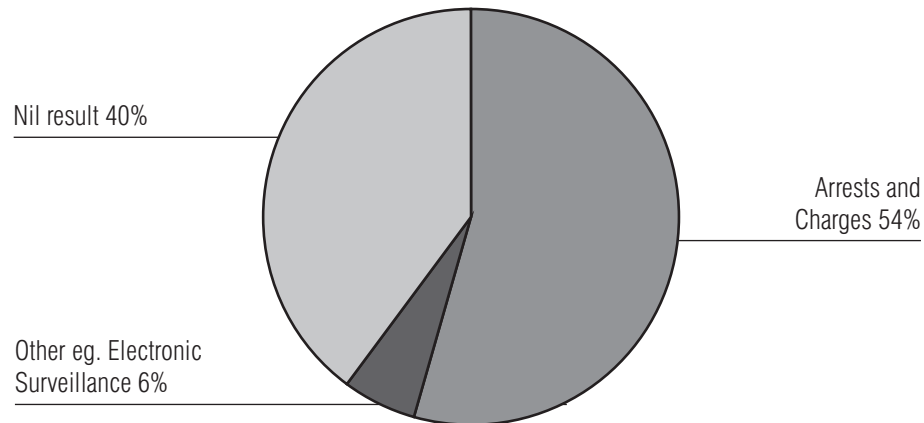
Section 23(2) of the Act requires that this report include certain particulars in relation to each law enforcement agency. Specific data relating to the operations conducted by NSW Police is included in tables annexed to this report. The records maintained by NSW Police and inspected by us disclose the following information⁵:

- There were 324 authorities granted by the Commissioner's delegates during the 2003/2004 reporting period. Of these 72 were varied. One application for a controlled operation was refused. One application for variation was refused. Seven urgent applications were made during the reporting period. Several applications were given identifying numbers but for one reason or another were not proceeded with prior to being formally considered for authorisation under the Act. As a result the numbers of operations listed in the appendix to this report may not be consecutive.
- The majority of the operations involved investigating criminal activities associated with the supply possession cultivation or manufacture of prohibited drugs. 195 controlled operations were conducted in respect to the supply of prohibited drugs. Another 79 targeted the supply of prohibited drugs along with other criminal activity such as manufacturing prohibited drugs, cultivation of prohibited plants, importation of prohibited drugs or possession and supply of firearms and other prohibited weapons. 12 operations solely targeted firearm and other prohibited weapons offences. 18 operations targeted robbery, theft or stolen property offences. There were 18 operations which involved the investigation of murder, conspiracy to murder or attempted murder. Six were targeted in relation to armed robbery and conspiracy to commit armed robbery. Two others were targeting offences relating to prostitution and four operations targeted fraud offences. The operations in total authorised 7,152 law enforcement participants and 193 civilian participants. The number of law enforcement participants authorised to be involved in individual operations ranged from zero to 231 while the number of civilian participants authorised for individual operations ranged from zero to three
- In relation to the 192 operations which were completed by 30 June 2004 and reported to the chief executive officer there were 359 law enforcement participants and 55 civilian participants who engaged in controlled activities.
- Since the majority of controlled operations involved investigations relating to the supply of prohibited drugs, the controlled activities engaged in for the purpose of the controlled operations generally involved conversations and negotiations involving the supply of prohibited drugs and the purchase and possession of prohibited drugs. Some operations also included discussions and negotiations and the purchase of firearms. A number of operations also included entry onto private property and the removal of vehicles.

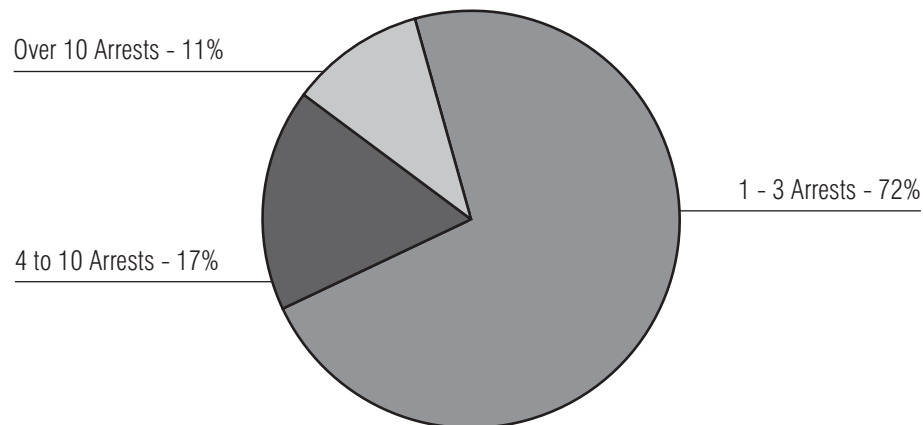

Outcome of inspections

The standard of record keeping of the NSW Police has greatly improved over the previous reporting period especially considering the 60% increase in the number of operations authorised. There are still some minor matters discussed below which generally can be attributed to quality control slippages.

The major problem of non-compliance with the requirements of the Act continues to be the failure of Principal Law Enforcement officers to provide a report on the results of the operation to the chief executive officer within the two month statutory time frame, despite the failure to do so being a breach of the code of conduct. I have written to the Commissioner outlining the individual matters and naming the officers concerned. Given the recommendation of the recent review of the Act proposing to devolve some authorisations to a lower level and a more streamlined level of accountability, it is of concern that some officers conducting operations do not exhibit an adequate regard for this current accountability obligation under the Act.

In respect to individual operations the following issues were noted:

02/098

The civilian undertaking on this file was a copy of the civilian undertaking from 02/142 and purported to include this operation. However, it was dated 27/9/02 and controlled activities on this operation occurred on 19/7/02. It appeared therefore that the controlled activities occurred prior to the undertaking being given.

03/170

It was not clear from the authority whether the civilian participant was authorised to operate under an assumed name or not. The Act requires this to be stated in the authority (section 8 (2) (d)).

03/196

The authority appeared to pre date the application. The application for this operation was dated 6/8/03 and the Deputy Commissioner initialled the application as 6/8/03. However, the authority was dated 5/8/03 as were the written reasons of the Deputy Commissioner required by section 6 (5) of the Act.

03/199

The authority authorised controlled activities to take place within an area defined in annexure "A", however there was no annexure "A" attached to the authority or on the file. The authority also included a condition that the activities be restricted to the Villawood/Chester Hill area. However, that area was also not further defined. In previous operations of this type the areas have been defined by providing a map of the specific boundaries of the Local Area Command. I believe that is best practice for operations of this type.

03/203

The civilian undertaking on this file appeared to be dated after the controlled activities took place as indicated in the report on the operation.

03/231

This authority authorised the controlled operation to take place from 5/9/03 until 5/9/03. It appeared from the application that a longer period of time was required. This appeared to be a clerical error in preparing the authority.

03/236

This authority authorised controlled activities from 12/9/03 until 12/9/03 where it appeared from the application that a longer period was required. Controlled activities took place on the 17/9/03. When this error was noted the authority was cancelled. This appeared to be an appropriate course of action. However, the operation replacing 03/236 was 03/249 and the application for this new operation indicated that no previous authority had been granted.

03/243

The application for this operation appeared to request a geographical boundary to the operation, being the Surry Hills Local Area Command attached at appendix "B" to the application. However the authority did not restrict the controlled activities nor did it specify a particular target. The description of the authorised controlled activities stated "Conversations and negotiations concerning the supply and/or conspiracy to supply prohibited drugs involving persons who are yet to be identified and any other person or persons involved in the commission of the said offences" This description, in the absence of a geographical boundary, did not appear to be specific enough to adequately describe the controlled activities authorised.

03/256

There were a number of discrepancies in the details of how many participants were authorised for this operation. The application requested 49 participants, the authority states that 47 participants are authorised

and the notification to the Ombudsman states that 44 participants were authorised. The report received on the operation also indicated that 47 participants were authorised and it is this figure which has been used in this report.

03/264

The Act at Section 6 (5) requires that written reasons are provided to indicate that the chief executive officer is satisfied as to the requirements referred to in subsection 6 (3) (a). There was no record of reasons on this file.

03/287

The application for this operation indicated that a variation for operation 03/137 had been refused and hence this fresh application had been made. However, the file 03/137 did not indicate that a variation had been refused.

04/041, 04/042 & 04/043

The authority for these three operations all indicated the same Principal Law Enforcement Officer as being authorised to conduct the controlled activities during these operations. Each of these operations were applied for on the same date. However, it appeared from the applications that each of the operations required three separate PLEO's and that the officer mentioned was only required for operation 04/043. Operation 04/041 was also varied and the variation named the PLEO originally named in the application for this operation but not named in the authority. It appeared that the listing of the same PLEO for all three authorities was an undetected clerical error.

04/171

The criminal activity (murder) described in the notification to the Ombudsman was different from the criminal activity outlined in the application. The application also indicated that a previous authority was granted for the same activity, 04/078, this authority also targeted different criminal activity than that stated in the notification for 04/171. I note that the notification for operation 04/170 also targeted murder as the criminal activity and this may have resulted in a clerical error in the notification for 04/171.

02/097, 03/195, 03/213 and 03/268

These authorities were all issued for 6 months and 1 day and hence were outside the six-month limit contained in the Act. Information received from Court and Legal Services Special Advice Section was that three of these authorities would be returned to the Deputy Commissioner for amendment and the other had been cancelled.

02/101, 03/300, 03/305, 03/328, 04/013

These operations were completed and reports provided to the chief executive officer, however no civilian undertaking was on the file. In all cases the civilian's involved conducted controlled activities.

Country Inspections

Inspections were conducted on the records of a random sample of operations held at a number of regional locations by each of the Principal Law Enforcement officers responsible. Inspections were conducted at Goulburn, Young, Orange, Dubbo and Mudgee Police Stations during the inspection period.

Goulburn – The records accounting for the controlled activities conducted during operations 03/182 and 03/201 were viewed on the police eagle i system. While my inspecting officers were satisfied that the controlled activities were properly accounted for, it was not possible to view the records of the undercover supervisors used in the operation. These records remained with the supervisors at other police locations. There was no apparent reason as to why the undercover supervisors were not able to leave copies of their notes with the Principal Law Enforcement officer.

Young – All records were available to account for the controlled activities carried out during operation 03/149. The Principal Law Enforcement officer expressed his view that he thought a lower level of authorisation would be beneficial for operations of this type as they were not complex.

Orange – Two issues arose in relation to operation 03/340. Firstly, it appeared from the records that some activities involving “conversations and negotiations for drug supply” took place without any purchases being made, however, these activities were not included in the report to the CEO’s delegate following the operation. It appeared that only those activities in which drugs were actually purchased were noted as controlled activities during the operation. Inspecting officers recommended that all controlled activities that had been authorised and were carried out should be reported to the CEO’s delegate.

Inspecting officers also inspected the records for operation 03/072. The principal law enforcement officer was unable to supply original records as to the identity of those who conducted the controlled activities. The activities were conducted by State Technical Investigation Branch (STIB) officers and the PLEO was then informed orally, for reasons of operational security, which officers undertook controlled activities. Apart from the mention in his report to the CEO, however, there were no records in his possession showing which law enforcement officers actually took part in the controlled activities. Inspecting officers subsequently received copies of the records from STIB confirming which officers had conducted the controlled activities.

Dubbo – Inspecting officers sought to examine records relating to operations 03/124 and 03/204, however they were unable to do so. It appeared that the records had been re-located to the State Crime Command and they will be subject to a future inspection.

Mudgee – Inspectors met with the Crime Manager, as the principal law enforcement officer for operation 03/232 was unavailable. The records for this operation were kept to a high standard and all controlled activities were easily accounted for.

7. NSW Police Professional Standards Command

The records maintained by NSW Police and reported on above, for security reasons, do not include those operations carried out by the NSW Police Professional Standards Command (PSC). The PSC maintains its own records which are subject to separate inspections by us. Specific data relating to the operations conducted by PSC is included in the tables annexed to this report.

- There were 10 authorities granted by the chief executive officer's delegate during the 2003/2004 reporting period. No applications for authorities were refused during the relevant period. There were three variations granted and no urgent applications applied for.
- Seven operations were conducted in respect to the criminal activity of supply prohibited drugs, one operation targeted sexual assault and child pornography, one targeted the offence of intimidate witness and one targeted corrupt conduct.
- There were 183 law enforcement participants and two civilian authorised to participate in the controlled operations conducted under the authorities. The number of law enforcement participants authorised in individual operations ranged from 0 to 50.
- The controlled activities engaged in while conducting these operations included conversations, negotiations, purchase, possession and other activities concerning the supply and manufacture of prohibited drugs, the entry onto private property and removal of a vehicle, conversations and negotiations relating to the payment of a bribe.
- In relation to the four operations which were completed by 30 June 2004, no controlled activities occurred in two of the operations, one involved purchasing prohibited drugs and one involved taking a motor vehicle. There were 14 law enforcement participants who engaged in controlled activities. No civilians engaged in controlled activities.

All applications, authorities, variations and reports were in order and in compliance with the requirements of the Act.

8. NSW Crime Commission

The records maintained by the NSW Crime Commission and inspected by us disclose the following information, which is reported pursuant to s23(2) of the Act. Specific data relating to the operations conducted by the NSW Crime Commission is included in the tables annexed to this report.

- There were 11 authorities granted during the 2003/2004 reporting period and no applications refused. None were urgent applications. Seven variations were granted in relation to three operations. One authority was varied five times and two others varied once. No applications for variations were refused.
- Three operations targeted the supply of prohibited drugs, one of which also targeted money laundering, three operations targeted serious damage to property and acts causing death or injury to persons, three targeted the cultivation of cannabis, one involved prohibited firearms and one involved money laundering.
- There were 50 law enforcement participants and six civilian participants authorised to participate in the controlled operations conducted under those operations. Three operations did not define the number of law enforcement participants authorised. These operations attempted to authorise a class or classes of persons (see comments below).
- There were nine law enforcement participants and two civilian participants who actually engaged in controlled activities for the purpose of the 12 operations completed by 30 June 2004.
- The controlled activities carried out during these operations included negotiations, purchase and possession of prohibited drugs, negotiate and purchase prohibited firearms, goods in custody and money laundering. Also a number of other operations involved the installation of surveillance equipment and hence required entering onto enclosed lands.

During the inspections of the records of the Crime Commission, all applications, authorities, variations and reports were in order and in compliance with the requirements of the Act apart from the following identified deficiency:

- In relation to operations 2004/203, 2004/204 and 2004/397 the authority purported to authorise law enforcement participants who belonged to a class of persons based on their locations within NSW Police. It was pointed out to Commission staff that the identity of individual law enforcement participants needs to be sufficiently particularised in authorisations. It should be noted that in any event no controlled activities took place in relation to these operations.

The Commission recognised that in the future all participants need to be adequately identified in the authority.

9. Independent Commission Against Corruption

The records maintained by the ICAC and inspected by us disclose the following information which is reported pursuant to s23(2) of the Act. Specific data relating to the ICAC operations is included in tables annexed to this report.

- There were seven authorities granted during the period to which this report relates. None were urgent applications. No applications for granting of authorities were refused.
- All the operations were conducted in respect to corrupt conduct.
- There were 26 law enforcement participants and four civilian participants authorised to participate in the controlled operations conducted under the authorities.
- In relation to the seven operations completed by 30 June 2004, there were 15 law enforcement participants and three civilian participants who actually engaged in controlled activities.
- The controlled activities engaged in while conducting these operations included offering, giving, soliciting and receiving a corrupt reward or commission and aiding and abetting the provision of a corrupt reward, enter onto premises and trespass.

All applications, authorities, variations and reports were in order and in compliance with the requirements of the Act.

10. Police Integrity Commission

The records maintained by the PIC and inspected by us disclose the following information which is reported pursuant to s23(2) of the Act. Specific data relating to the operations conducted by the PIC is included in the tables annexed to this report.

- There were nine authorities granted by the chief executive officer during the 2003/2004 reporting period and none refused. Two variations of authorities were granted.
- Three authorities targeted the supply of prohibited drugs and attempted robbery. One involved offences of attempted murder, harass or intimidate. One targeted conspiracy to steal, two involved conspiracy to enter or enter a dwelling house with intent to commit a serious indictable offence and two involved corrupt conduct.
- There were 50 law enforcement participants and four civilians authorised for these controlled operations. Seven operations were completed by 30 June 2004 in which, 15 law enforcement officers and three civilian participants engaged in the controlled activities.
- The controlled activities engaged in for the controlled operations included conversations and negotiations involving prohibited drugs, entering private property and take vehicle, trespass to real property and activities concerning stolen goods and also corrupt conduct.

All applications, authorities, variations and reports were in order and in compliance with the requirements of the Act.

11. Australian Crime Commission

The records maintained by the ACC and inspected by us disclose the following information which is reported pursuant to s23(2) of the Act. Specific data relating to the ACC operations is included in tables annexed to this report.

- There were three authorities granted during the 2003/2004 reporting period and no applications refused. No urgent applications were made.
- All three authorities related to the possession, acquisition and sale of handguns.
- There were no law enforcement participants and three civilian participants authorised to participate in the controlled operations conducted under those authorities.
- One operation was completed and no controlled activities were conducted.

All applications, authorities, variations and reports were in order and in compliance with the requirements of the Act.

12. Australian Federal Police

During the reporting period the AFP did not conduct controlled operations under this Act.

13. Australian Customs Service

During the reporting period the ACS did not conduct controlled operations under this Act.

14. Notifications

Section 21 of the *Law Enforcement (Controlled Operations) Act* requires that the Ombudsman be notified in writing when an authority or any variation to an authority is granted and when a report on the conduct of an authorised operation is received by the chief executive officer of the agency.

All agencies that conducted operations during the reporting period complied with the notification requirements set out in s21 of the Act and cl 9,10,11 and 12 of the Regulation with the following exceptions⁶:

New South Wales Police

There were three occasions during the reporting period when the notification of the granting of an authority was delayed beyond the 21 day statutory requirement. In all of the cases the notifications were inadvertently overlooked at the time of authorisation.

Two notifications in relation to receipt of reports took longer than the statutory requirement of 21 days.

The Act requires the CEO to be presented with a report on the operation within two months of its completion. There were 48 cases where the report on the conduct of the operation was not delivered to the CEO within the two-month statutory period.
